

Resolution

By the International Agency for Chiropractic Evaluation

Whereas, D.D. Palmer founded the chiropractic profession on the discovery that vertebral subluxation (VS) occurs and interferes with the performance of the nerve system; and

Whereas, addressing vertebral subluxation has far-reaching implications regarding performance and health; and

Whereas, the safe and effective analysis and adjusting of VS is the core value of the chiropractic profession; and

Whereas, numerous chiropractic post-graduate training systems and organizations exist to advance vertebral subluxation centered chiropractic; and

Whereas, there exists no avenue for post-graduate training systems and organizations to gain certification or endorsement relevant to their training related to identifying, characterizing and adjusting and advancing vertebral subluxation centered chiropractic; and

Whereas, a sustainable path for VS centered chiropractic demands quality life-long training and enrichment of practitioners and the dissemination of information about VS to the public; and

Whereas, the Sustainability Committee has requested that the International Agency for Chiropractic Evaluation (IACE) add the certification of relevant post-graduate training systems and organizations related to dissemination of information, identification, characterization and adjustment of VS to its mission.

Now therefore, the International Agency for Chiropractic Evaluation accepts the charge to explore the processes, procedures, and planning necessary to initiate the development of a framework to fill this void.
